



The Six Pillars in Action Classroom Activity- Middle School

Goal: To reflect on how the Pillars were demonstrated by players, coaches, officials, fans and your students at the game.

Materials: "Sportsmanship by the Six Pillars" and "The Six Pillars In Action" worksheets

Preparation:

- 1. Review the Six Pillars of Character using your building or classroom materials or the "Sportsmanship by the Six Pillars" list on the nextpage.
- 2. Review the items in "The Six Pillars in Action at the Basketball Game Worksheet." Revise the list, if needed, to reflect your curriculum or student interests or needs.
- 3. Decide if you will focus on all of the Pillars or if you will choose fewer for this activity. You might want to divide the class and have small groups work on individual Pillars.

Directions:

- 1. Review the Six Pillars of Character with the class. This can be done with the list on the following page or with existing classroom materials.
- 2. Share which of the Pillars (or all, if that is what has been chosen) the class will be talking about.

Ask students to think about how the Pillar(s) were demonstrated by people at the game (players, coaches, officials, fans) and by your class.

If this is to continue as a group activity, discuss the items listed under each Pillar on the worksheet and begin to fill in the columns.

If this is not a group activity, invite the students to complete the worksheet individually or in small groups

- How did the players, coaches, officials and fans demonstrate the Pillars?
- How did the students in your class demonstrate the Pillars?
- 3. This activity can extend into a writing activity. Ask students to write about their experience at the game. Which Pillar was most evident at the game? Give examples. How did this impact their experience at the game?

Sportsmanship by the Six Pillars

TRUSTWORTHINESS

Always pursue victory with honor • Demonstrate and demand scrupulous integrity • Observe and enforce the spirit and letter of rules • Don't compromise education and character development goals • Don't engage in or tolerate dishonesty, cheating or dishonorable conduct

RESPECT

Treat the traditions of the sport and other participants with respect • Don't engage in or tolerate disrespectful conduct including verbal abuse of opponents and officials, profane or belligerent "trash talking" • Taunting and unseemly celebrations • Win with grace and lose with dignity

RESPONSIBILITY

Be a positive role model on and off the field and require the same of athletes • Further the mental, social and moral development of athletes and teach life skills that enhance personal success and social responsibility • Maintain competence including basic knowledge of character building, first aid/safety, coaching principles.

FAIRNESS

Adhere to high standards of fair play • Treat players fairly according to their abilities • Never take unfair advantage • Be open-minded

CARING

Assure that the academic, emotional, physical and moral well-being of athletes is always placed above desires and pressures to win • Do no permit reckless or potentially unsafe behavior of athletes

CITIZENSHIP

Avoid gamesmanship and promote sportsmanship by honoring the rules and goals of the sport • Establish codes of conduct for coaches, athletes, parents and spectators • Safeguard the health of athletes and the integrity of the sport by prohibiting the use of alcohol and tobacco • Demand compliance with all laws and regulations, including those relating to gambling and the use of drugs
